Proposed Action Title: Mercury Characterization Activities (NV-2017-001)

Program or Field Office: Nevada Field Office

Location(s) (City/County/State): Nevada National Security Site (NNSS), Nye County NV

Proposed Action Description:

For this project, characterization activities would take place in Mercury, Nevada, located in Area 23 at the Nevada National Security Site. Results of the characterization activities would be used for planning purposes and in conjunction with subsequent NEPA analysis related to the Mercury Redevelopment Project. The scope of the characterization phase includes the following activities:

- Housekeeping and relocation of equipment and materials currently stored in cargo containers at the site near the former Environmental Restoration dorms. Equipment would be consolidated into fewer cargo boxes, or removed to other facilities for reuse, or for excess. The remaining cargo boxes would be relocated across the street to another existing concrete pad in an area not included in this project.
- Non-invasive site surveys (radiological, utility, land, biological, and cultural) would be conducted. These surveys would provide information to assist in evaluation and planning activities. Activities would be conducted in previously disturbed areas within Mercury.
