**NEVADA STUDENTS TO TEST THEIR KNOWLEDGE
Nevada Science Bowl champion will be crowned this Saturday**

160 students from 29 high schools will face-off this Saturday in the 24th Annual Nevada Science Bowl. The Nevada Science Bowl features a fast-paced format where students “buzz-in” and answer tough questions covering biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics, astronomy, and more.

The top 12 teams will win cash prizes for use in their school’s math/science department. The first place team wins \$5000, plus an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, DC, for the Department of Energy’s National Science Bowl in April.

The Nevada Science Bowl will be held at VegasPBS studios with the first matches getting underway at 7:30 a.m., Saturday, January 31, 2015. The competition will continue throughout the day until a champion emerges around 4 p.m.

“Young people need our support and encouragement to focus on science, technology, engineering and math,” said Steve Lawrence, the National Nuclear Security Administration Nevada Field Office Manager. “We are proud to sponsor the Nevada Science Bowl and help prepare the next generation of scientists and researchers.”
