DAVIDSON ACADEMY OF NEVADA WINS 2016 NEVADA SCIENCE BOWL Dozens of high schools compete for Nevada Science Bowl title

Davidson Academy of Nevada roared to victory on Saturday in the 2016 Nevada Science Bowl. 32 teams started the day squaring off in the 25th Annual Nevada Science Bowl. Davidson Academy of Nevada, from Reno, defeated Las Vegas' Clark High School in the championship match after nearly 11 hours of spirited competition. Davidson Academy won the \$5000 first prize and will represent Nevada in the Department of Energy's National Science Bowl in April.
