

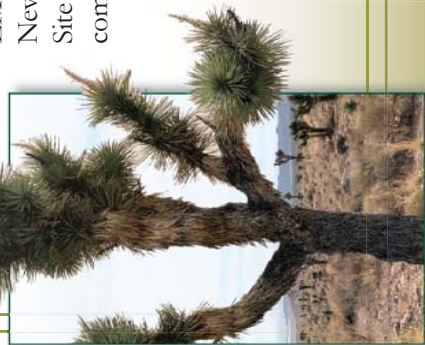

Environmental Management

Environmental Management (EM) was established in 1989 to assess the impacts of historic nuclear weapons research and testing at the Nevada National Security Site. This program, conducted by the U.S. Department of Energy, National Nuclear Security Administration Nevada Field Office, must also explore strategies for restoring contaminated sites while implementing safe, responsible methods for disposing waste.

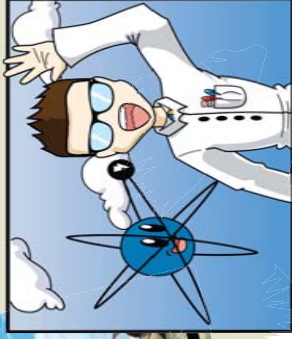
Keeping affected communities informed about these activities has been, and continues to be, an integral part of the EM philosophy. The EM team, therefore, has created a number of outreach resources, including student learning materials that illustrate in detail what this important EM work means for the Nevada National Security Site and surrounding communities.



Educational Outreach

Operation Clean Desert

Operation Clean Desert is a set of activities following the adventures of Dr. Proton and Adam the Atom as they learn about the Nevada National Security Site. The Operation Clean Desert learning program provides details on environmental concerns such as groundwater and radioactive waste disposal. Available resources include an activity book and teacher's lesson plan with student worksheet.



Open Houses

The Nevada Field Office hosts a variety of community open houses to provide people the opportunity to learn more about EM programs at the Nevada National Security Site. These open houses are typically held in rural locations near the Nevada National Security Site, such as Pahrump, Beatty and Amargosa Valley.
