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## Visitor Certification of Vaccination

The purpose of this form is to document compliance with federal requirements for visitor vaccination status against COVID-19 and to protect the health and safety of all employees, subcontractors, visitors, and other individuals to NNSS buildings. If you fail to complete this signed attestation form or any required negative COVID-19 test, you will be denied entry to the NNSS and NNSS buildings.

### My Vaccination Status

By checking below, I declare that the following statement is true:

- I am fully vaccinated.<sup>1</sup>
- I am not fully vaccinated.<sup>2</sup>
- I have not been vaccinated.<sup>3</sup>
- I decline to respond.

<sup>1</sup> An individual is fully vaccinated if they are:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen Vaccine.

If you do not meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are **not** fully vaccinated.

<sup>2</sup> Either I have received my first dose of Moderna or Pfizer, and my second appointment is scheduled, or I received my final dose less than two weeks ago.

<sup>3</sup> If you are not vaccinated due to medical or religious reasons, please check either "I have not been vaccinated" or "I decline to respond."

### I understand that if I decline to respond or I am not fully vaccinated, I must comply with the following safety protocols while in NNSS buildings:

- Perform a daily self-health check;
- Wear a face mask as required when in buildings and in shared vehicles when on the NNSS;
- Physically distance; and
- Provide a proof of having received a negative COVID-19 test taken no more than 72 hours prior to being on-site.

I hereby certify that the above is true and correct, and that I am the person named below. Checking "I decline to respond" does not constitute a false statement, but will be considered as a "I have not been vaccinated" response. I understand that a knowing and willful false statement on this form can be punished by fine or imprisonment or both (18 U.S.C. 1001).

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**Directions and Notice to Visitors:** In accordance with [federal requirements](#), all individuals visiting NNSS must attest to their vaccination status. All NNSS employees who sponsor visitors must provide them with a Visitor Certification of Vaccination form. The visitor must complete the form, inform the sponsor of their vaccination status, provide as required a negative COVID-19 viral test taken within 72 hours prior to arrival on site, and keep the form and as required test result in their possession while on site. The sponsor must verify the form is completed and have reviewed the required test result prior to the visitor's entrance to NNSS property.

All individuals visiting the NNSS must:

- Complete a Visitor Certification of Vaccination Form.
- Provide proof of a negative FDA-authorized viral COVID-19 test within 72 hours prior to arrival on site if not fully vaccinated, not been vaccinated, or decline to respond.
- Keep the form and vaccination card or test result on their person at all times.

All NNSS employees who sponsor visitors must:

- Provide all visitors with a Visitor Certification of Vaccination form and verify it is completed.
- Review and verify documentation of the visitor's full vaccination status or a negative viral COVID-19 test result received within 72 hours prior to arrival.
- Inform and verify the visitor's compliance with COVID-19 protocols while on site, including performing a daily self-health check and wearing a mask indoors.

The COVID-19 test taken by the visitor must be authorized by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to detect current infection. Lists of approved [antigen diagnostic tests](#) and [molecular diagnostic tests](#) are available on the [FDA website](#).

COVID-19 test must be taken within 72 hours prior to the first day of site access, and visitors are required to test every 72 hours thereafter for the full length of the visit. The sponsor must review and verify the new test result every 72 hours. Unvaccinated visitors without a negative COVID-19 test conducted within 72 hours prior to their arrival on-site will not be allowed on site.

Approved testing methods include:

- In-store or drive-through point-of-care (POC testing, such as at pharmacies)
- Swab-testing capabilities that enable an individual to collect the specimen using a self-collection kit with drop off at a designation location or shipping to an approved laboratory
- Over-the-counter tests or other self-administered tests, as long as those tests are not both self-administered and self-read by the individual unless observed by NNSS Occupational Medicine or an authorized telehealth provider with provided test report.
