Prohibited Items

Personal belongings are subject to search.

- Cameras/Camcorders
- Cellular phones
- Backpacks
- Bluetooth enabled devices
- Portable Data Storage Devices/Computers
- Recording Devices
- Weapons or Explosives
- Pets and Animals
- Ammunition
- Controlled Substances
- Incendiary Devices
- Binoculars or Optical Instruments
- Alcoholic Beverages
- Chemical Irritants
- Global Positioning System (GPS)
- Recorders
- Geiger Counters/Dosimeters
- Tracking devices such as, but not limited to Apple Air Tags, Tile Trackers, etc.
- Any Item Prohibited by Law



Acceptable Forms of Identification

- **REAL ID compliant State-issued driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent) or one of the following:**



- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card
- U.S. Customs and Border Protection trusted traveler card (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. military ID card
- U.S. military dependent's ID card
- Department of Homeland Security designated Enhanced Driver's License
- Native American tribal photo ID
- HSPD-12 PIV card from any government agency (for identification only)
- Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC)



Appropriate Attire

Long pants, sleeved shirts, closed toe sturdy shoes. Hats recommended during warmer months. Water bottles encouraged.

No shorts, sandals, tank tops, or heels of any kind are permitted.
