Economic Impact

Overall, the Nevada National Security Sites (NNSS) provides a nearly \$1 billion economic impact in Nevada. Roughly 3,500 employees across six government agencies, nine prime contractors and three national laboratories work daily for the NNSS to ensure the security of the United States and its allies by supporting the stewardship of the nuclear deterrent, providing emergency response capability and training, and contributing to key nonproliferation and arms control initiatives. The NNSS executes unique, national-level experiments, delivers technical and administrative support to national security customers, and provides long-term environmental stewardship for site missions.

NNSS Support to Nevada

- For the 2024 fiscal year, procurement totaled \$349.2 million; \$244.6 million was spent toward small businesses for the 2024 fiscal year.
- Educational institutions in Nevada received funding of approximately \$634,000.
- The total replacement value of infrastructure at the NNSS has reached \$9.86 billion.
- Under the Environmental Management program, the NNSS provides more than \$3.3 million to Nevada for oversight of the NNSS Low-Level Radioactive Waste disposal program, approximately \$735,000 to Nevada for oversight of NNSS Environmental Restoration activities and more than \$680,000 to Nevada Division of Emergency Management through waste fees. Through these waste fees, the NNSS has provided roughly \$16 million to support emergency preparedness in Nevada since 2000.
- The Remote Sensing Laboratory at Nellis Air Force Base provides radiological emergency response, including aerial radiological monitoring. This response supports law enforcement at events such as the Super Bowl and New Year's Eve in Las Vegas.
- The NNSS Emergency Management program routinely coordinates with first responders at the local and state level to ensure integrated emergency response.

Our Community

Community Support

NNSS is involved with community-building organizations through board participation, business advice, and/ or financial contributions. These organizations include: Vegas Chamber; Atomic Museum; Pahrump Valley Chamber of Commerce; and the Las Vegas Global Economic Alliance. Through educational and community outreach, the NNSS donated nearly \$850,000 to the community.

Community Outreach

NNSS also supports several local and regional community relief organizations. In fiscal year 2024, 700 NNSS volunteers donated 1,540 hours to the community. Highlights from the year include renovating two southern Nevada homes through Rebuilding Together Southern Nevada to provide critical home repairs to low-income seniors, veterans and individuals with disabilities; supplying and outfitting Las Vegas-area youth with new footwear through the Goodie Two Shoes Foundation to ensure disadvantaged children have access to new shoes; and packaging meals with Three Square Food Bank for individuals and families at risk of hunger.

STEM Education

As stewards of a highly technical mission, NNSS fosters local and regional STEM education for students in elementary school through college. NNSS employees volunteered **506** hours at **9** STEM events and staffed another **13** STEM events to engage with students

and provide a window into future career opportunities.

Supported organizations include: Nevada Science Bowl; FIRST Nevada; ASCE Southern Nevada Region Future City; University of Nevada, Las Vegas; University of Nevada, Reno; Clark and Nye County School Districts; and DISCOVERY Children's Museum.

University Partnerships

Support for Nevada universities in Las Vegas and Reno include board participation, research collaborations, approximately \$634,000 in financial support, senior design projects, graduate research opportunities and undergraduate summer internships.
