Work Plan Item 2:	Low-Level Waste (LLW) Visual Verification

Description:	Background: Radioactive Waste Acceptance Program (RWAP) conducts LLW visual verifications at generator sites throughout the country. These verifications focus on the packaging of waste into the shipping containers to ensure the waste is consistent with the waste profile and meets the Nevada National Security Sites Waste Acceptance Criteria (NNSS WAC). Up to two members from the NSSAB will be invited to observe RWAP conducting a LLW visual verification. These members will present their observations to the Full Board.
	NSSAB Scope: From a community perspective, the NSSAB will provide recommendations for how RWAP's visual verifications could be enhanced.

Description:	Background: Radioactive Waste Acceptance Program (RWAP) conducts LLW facility evaluations at generator sites throughout the country. These facility evaluations evaluate the generator's waste program to verify continued compliance with the Nevada National Security Sites Waste Acceptance Criteria (NNSS WAC). Up to two members from the NSSAB will be invited to observe RWAP conducting a LLW facility evaluation. These members will present their observations to the Full Board. NSSAB Scope: From a community perspective, the NSSAB will provide
	recommendations for how RWAP's facility evaluations could be enhanced.

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Work Plan Item 4:	Real-Time Radiography (RTR) Operations at the Area 5 Radioactive Waste
	Management Complex (RWMC) at the Nevada National Security Sites (NNSS)
Briefing/Discussion Date:	January 2024
Recommendation Deadline:	July 2024
Description:	Background: Radioactive Waste Acceptance Program (RWAP) conducts real-time radiography (RTR – essentially x-ray technology) on waste containers received by generators across the DOE complex at the Area 5 RWMC. RTR examinations are used to verify compliance with the NNSS Waste Acceptance Criteria for disposal at the NNSS. Up to two members (due to the size of the facility only one member at a time can observe) from the NSSAB will be invited to observe RWAP conducting an RTR evolution. These members will present their observations to the Full Board. NSSAB Scope: From a community perspective, the NSSAB will provide recommendations for how RWAP's RTR operations could be enhanced.

Work Plan Item 5:	Transfer Process of Environmental Management (EM) Sites on the Nevada National Security Sites (NNSS) to National Nuclear Security Administration/Nevada Field Office (NNSA/NFO)

Description:	Background: In April 2024, the EM Nevada Program will provide a briefing to the NSSAB on the normal transfer process for the stewardship of sites; the differences that the Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (FFACO) sites on the NNSS present from this process; a tentative timeline and draft Site Transition Plan outline. NSSAB Scope: From a community perspective, the NSSAB will provide a recommendation on specific topics to be included in the final Site Transition Plan and how and to whom it should be communicated.
