This policy outlines Management and Operating (M&O) Contractor intentions and principles regarding environmental performance. Within the M&O Contractor organization, the Senior Director, Operations & Environmental Management Program is responsible for monitoring environmental performance and reporting on performance to senior management. This policy is incorporated into the M&O Contractor Integrated Safety Management System and implemented by the M&O Contractor Environmental Management System (EMS). The M&O Contractor policy is to:

- A. Protect environmental quality and human welfare by implementing EMS practices that conform to International Organization for Standardization ISO 14001:2015, "Environmental management systems – Requirements with guidance for use."
- B. Minimize environmental impacts caused by M&O Contractor activities and services by preventing pollution and protecting the natural environment.
- C. Use sustainable practices and purchase sustainable products to prevent degradation of resources.
- D. Continually improve the EMS by reviewing performance, and making adjustments to achieve established objectives.
- E. Operate in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local regulations and contractual requirements related to environmental protection and performance.
- F. Rigorously review operations and correct non-compliances as they are discovered.
- G. Consider environmental justice and potential negative environmental impacts on disadvantaged communities and those with environmental justice concerns.
