

NEVADA NATIONAL SECURITY SITE (NNSS) TRAFFIC RULES

All persons driving at the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS) shall obey the established traffic regulations, and any person doing any forbidden act, or failing to perform any act required by the traffic regulations shall be subject to penalties applicable to the offense.

To further ensure that all persons using the roadways at NNSS shall do so in a careful and safe manner, and in accordance with Title 10 Code of Federal Regulations Part 861, the following specific supplementary requirements for the operation of traffic upon these streets and roads must also be obeyed:

1. A driver shall be in possession of a current and valid state or territory issued driver's license and vehicle registration, and the vehicle shall display all current and valid tags and licenses required by the jurisdiction in which it is registered.
2. A driver who has had his or her privilege or license to drive suspended or revoked by any state, territory, or due to onsite safety infractions shall not drive any vehicle at the NNSS during such period of suspension or revocation.
3. Drivers shall always drive in a careful and safe manner and shall comply with the signals and directions of the protective force and other authorized individuals, all traffic signs, speed limits, pedestrian crosswalks, and all rules of the road.
4. Drivers shall not talk, send, or receive messages or search the internet on a cellular telephone or other handheld wireless device unless using a hands-free accessory.
5. Drivers and passengers shall wear a safety belt when operating a motor vehicle.
6. Drivers shall not operate any vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and/or any substance which renders the driver incapable of safely driving or exercising actual physical control of a vehicle.
7. Drivers shall not block entrances, driveways, walks, loading platforms, or fire hydrants.
8. Drivers shall not park without authority, park in unauthorized locations or in locations reserved for other persons, or park in any manner contrary to the direction of posted signs.
9. Drivers will not circumvent any safety or security barriers.
10. Drivers shall not overtake or proceed past any bus that is stopped or preparing to stop, whether traveling in the same or opposite direction as the bus and shall stop such vehicle at least ten feet from the front or rear of where passengers enter or exit the bus. The vehicle shall remain stopped until all passengers have boarded the bus and all passengers leaving the bus have exited the roadway and reached a place of safety.

11. Drivers approaching special convoy escorts with blue flashing lights shall pull to the side of the road when safely possible. If pulling over is not possible, the driver shall slow their vehicle for passage of an oncoming convoy. If the convoy is travelling in the same direction, drivers shall maintain a safe distance from the rear of the convoy unless otherwise instructed by the protective force.
12. Telematics installed in government owned motor vehicles will be monitored to ensure compliance with speed limits and traffic regulations.
13. Drivers of authorized emergency vehicles, when responding to an emergency call or when in pursuit of an actual or suspected violator of the law or when responding to but not upon returning from a fire alarm, are exempted from speed limits and traffic signs as long as the driver does not endanger life or property.
14. All government vehicle accidents shall be reported to the protective force and the Management and Operating Contractor motor vehicle fleet department.
15. All personal vehicle accidents shall be reported to the protective force, who will contact law enforcement if necessary.

Nye County Sheriff's Office law enforcement personnel are under contract with the Nevada Field Office to provide traffic enforcement at the NNSS. Drivers found to be in violation of the above rules are subject to ticketing, disciplinary action, and/or revocation of NNSS driving privileges.
